Extracts from the SOFCOT internal rules

Work formerly printed or presented to a learned society (other than the SOFCOT daughter societies) cannot be presented at the congress.

Any contribution, lecture or e-poster which is not the work of the main author or one of the co-authors will lead to exclusion of such author or co-authors from the Society for two years.

Submission of an abstract implies the authors' agreement, should the abstract be accepted, for publication in the Society's journal, in the orthopaedic proceedings of the *Journal of Bone and Joint Surgery* (British) and on their web site. It is thus necessary to follow the following instructions:

1) the text should be no longer than 400 words.

Submissions are to be typewritten (single spaced, courier typeface, 10 pts, without tables or figures)

Submissions not meeting these conditions can be rejected.

2) reports of clinical or experimental research results are structured as follows :

a) Purpose of the study

- b) Material for a clinical or experimental study describing the population or the sample under study
- c) Methods: operative methods, measurement techniques, clinical or experimental evaluation, etc.
- d) Results reported without comments or discussion
- e) Discussion concerning the purpose of the study, the methodology, in relation to earlier publications
- f) Conclusion for prospective deductions and clinical impact of experimental research

Contributions are assessed anonymously, the title and the text of the abstract should not contain any information allowing the reader to ascertain the origin of the work. The submission must be approved by all co-authors. The committee will be obliged to reject submissions which do not abide by this rule. Contributions which are accepted will be included in the Abstract Book given to each participant at the Congress.

CONGRESS AWARDS

- > **SOFCOT(*)** : 2000 € award for the best contribution

(*) Contributions accepted for the congress and presented by an author who is less than 35 years old. The awardees are chosen by a jury upon submission of the contribution (printout or electronic submission) including the PowerPoint presentation and the detailed text. These documents must arrive at the Society's secretarial office at least one month before the Congress.

A word from the Presidents :

SOFCOT is on the move !

2894 members and 735 junior members strong, the SOFCOT is on the move. For 1 260 000 € the Society has just acquired 334 sq.m. more office space next to the former offices. This will improve the Society's working conditions, house the Society's journal, and open meeting rooms for different entities composing the Society.

SOFCOT is on the move. A record number of grants in 2009 allowed the Society to award 254 650 € to young orthopaedists in training.

SOFCOT is on the move. The annual subscriptions to the journals reached 129 753 € with Springer, Sciences Direct and OVID allowing on-line consultation of 63 journals and 197 books.

SOFCOT is on the move. The foundation of Associated Societies has allowed Societies with a minority of orthopaedists to create links with SOFCOT.

SOFCOT is on the move. Under the co-signature of Orthorisq and the Academy, a letter was addressed to insurance companies expressing ardent concern about increasing police rates for professional responsibility insurance.

SOFCOT is on the move. The creation of the National Professional Council responds to the requirement for Continuous Professional Development stated in the HPST law and mandated by the Superior Health Authority.

SOFCOT is on the move, keeping pace with our rapidly evolving profession.
